The history of Trollhaugen....

1999 to 2009....

Our memories are a little fuzzy with the whirlwind of the past 20 odd years. We are looking for someone to compile and organize any of the records and photos that might still be available from these years. Let us know if you are interested!

Attendance during this period was strong averaging around 160, even up to almost 190 one year. During this time, Trollhaugen continued to share Norwegian culture through skits and plays. We also celebrated the talent among our campers through talent shows.

The abundance of campers also meant we needed more volunteers to share the teaching. The list of 'staff' volunteers each year is extensive - certainly longer than the lists associated with the first few years of camp. We also started seeing an entire generation of campers grow up and become 'teachers' themselves - this is a testament to the success of Trollhaugen.

Of course, as the kids aged, so did the adults. With each passing year, our Trollhaugen family loses a few more. It is heartbreaking to lose our friends and family. Each person has left a lasting effect on camp and it is thanks to those dedicated campers and volunteers that we have such a strong foundation for Trollhaugen, and a legacy that will last for generations.

Trollhaugen looked for ways to encourage and develop the next generation of 'teachers' through the addition of assistant teachers and a leadership class.

Trollhaugen has also helped Deer Valley Meadows (DVM) over the years. Did you know that the playhouse near the dinning hall was originally built by Red Deer Sons of Norway and Trollhaugen volunteers, and in the 90's funds were donated to update the playhouse. Funds have also been donated to DVM for other various upgrades such as the shower house and wood shop.

Trollhaugen volunteers cooked all their own meals up until about 2000. With aging volunteers, and changes to food preparation policies it made sense to have DVM begin serving our meals.

Did you know?

Fun was had by all, and we missed you!



Recipe:

Flat Bread

DESCRIPTION

A quintessential traditional Norwegian recipe: A thin, crispy, very slightly sweet flatbread that is good eaten plain, with butter or as a part of a Scandinavian-style appetizer spread.

INGREDIENTS

3 cups buttermilk 1 cup bran ½ - ½ cup sugar 2 tsp salt 2 cups flour 1 cup rolled oats (not instant)3 cups whole wheat flour1 tsp baking soda2 tsp baking powder1 cup melted butter

INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Mix baking soda, salt, baking powder, and shite flour together.
- 2. Add oats, bran, whole wheat flour, and mix well.
- 3. Make a well in the dry ingredients, and add melted butter and buttermilk. Mix well.
- 4. Taking spoonfuls at a time, roll out very thinly.
- 5. Bake on an ungreased griddle at 325 degrees and turn when brown. Place in a warm oven to dry.
- 6. Stacked flatbread can be covered with a cloth and a weight to keep them flat after they have cooled.

MIDNIGHT SUN


Some areas above the Arctic Circle in Norway receive 24 hours of sunlight from April 20 through August 22that's 124 days of sun!
